Best Practice: 2

- **Title:** Exhibition on Life Sketches & Portraits of Women Freedom Fighters
- **Objectives of the Practice:**
 - An attempt to recall and remember forgotten Women of our Freedom Struggle.
 - To recreate and bring forth stories which lay as faded memories of the past.
 - To inspire and encourage the Youth about the relevance and gravity of freedom and Independence.
 - To pay tribute and respect to the bravery of unsung women freedom Fighters.
 - To facilitate the youth and scholars to shoulder the accountability for fulfilling the countries efforts in recording the history of freedom fighters.
 - To celebrate Azadi ka Amrit Mohatswa in a unique manner.
- **Context:** In this era of competitions and day-to-day tough life, the youth hardly find time for remembrance of our rich heritage and past. This becomes most crucial when the Nation celebrates Azadi ka Amrit Mohatsav. So the Institution planed to celebrate and organize Exhibition on Life Sketches and Portraits of Brave India Women who participated in the Freedom movement by all means.
- **Practice:** The College organized an exhibition on Life Sketches and Portraits of fifty women freedom fighters to display their contribution and struggle in freedom movement from 1857 to 1947. The portraits exhibited their personal details and their particular role in freedom movement. The exhibition was inaugurated by Dr. Subhash Dahiya, Principal C.R. Polytechnic Institute Rohtak in the college campus. The exhibition was displayed for 15 days. The students, staff of our college, other Institutions and the media persons visited the exhibition.
- **Evidence of success:** It was a unique kind of exhibition. The media had a vast coverage and published special articles about the exhibition (Press coverage is attached). It has become a medium of inspiration and encouragement for the coming generation. It created a spirit of nationalism by enriching our hearts and soul. Through this practice the youth may be ignited about significant landmarks during India's freedom movement. It echoes motivation from freedom warriors, new visions, new resolutions and self dependence. This collection of information about these women freedom fighters will always remain with the institute and will always motivate and inspire the youth.
- **Problems Encountered and Resources Required:** Problems in having collection of authentic information about role of unsung women freedom fighters. It was a difficult task to collect and find out authentic source of the information. Along with this the financial crunch is always there to carry out the projects.
